What we've been doing this term...

Super Seasons

Our topic this term has been *Super Seasons* and has seen us learning all about the four seasons and the different types of weather we might expect at different times of year. We really enjoyed singing the *Seasons Song* every week and talking about how the weather and trees have been changing outside.

As part of our topic we have also been watching weather reports and learning about the different symbols used to represent the different types of weather. We had lots of fun making up our own weather reports and sharing them with the class! Whilst looking at these reports we also learnt about compass points and directions. We won't forget these easily, as we can remember that Naughty Elephants Squirt



Water and use this to recall that, working clockwise around a compass, we go through North, East, South and West.

We have taken inspiration from our topic work for Art this term, create our own Autumn Tree Collage by cutting leaf shapes from a range of different materials. To make the tree trunks we went outside and used crayons to create our own bark rubbings which looked particularly effective.

Material Investigators

In Science we have been learning about Materials. We have been investigating a range of objects to find out which materials they are made from, using scientific names wherever possible (such as glass, metal, paper, wood, china and plastic). We have also extended our vocabulary by using words to describe these substances, comparing rough and smooth, rigid and flexible, light and heavy, transparent and opaque materials.

Over the course of the term, we have extended our learning by exploring the properties of different materials, grouping them in different ways, thinking about the reasons why particular substances are used for particular purposes, and starting to apply this to our design work in DT.



Maths


We have been busy learning number facts and strategies for addition and subtraction in maths, especially how to add using an empty number line. We have also been practising our basic number facts, quickly recalling numbers that make 10 and 20, as well as the subtraction facts that go with them (20 - 8 = 12, 20 - 11 = 9 etc). We have also been working hard to learn our 2, 5 and 10 times tables, taking home (and bringing in) our times tables packs every week to help us to improve our recall of these facts. We are looking forward to receiving lots of certificates this year!

Over the past half-term we have also learnt how to partition numbers into tens and units and have been challenging ourselves to remember doubling and halving facts, as well as tackling two- and even three-digit numbers. Finally, towards the end of the term we have been learning about a variety of 2D and 3D shapes, naming them and describing their properties using mathematical vocabulary.
